**ASHLEY**

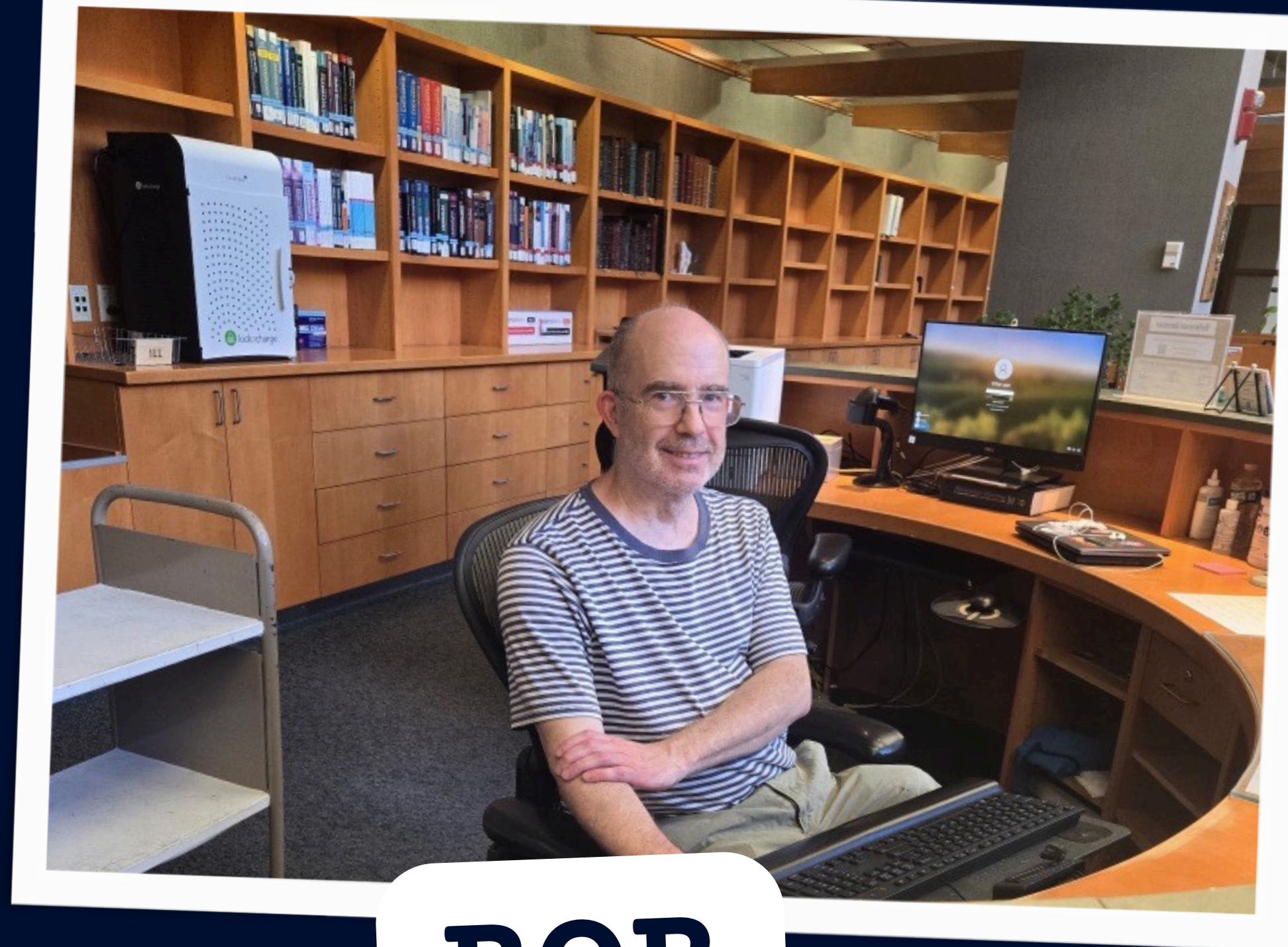

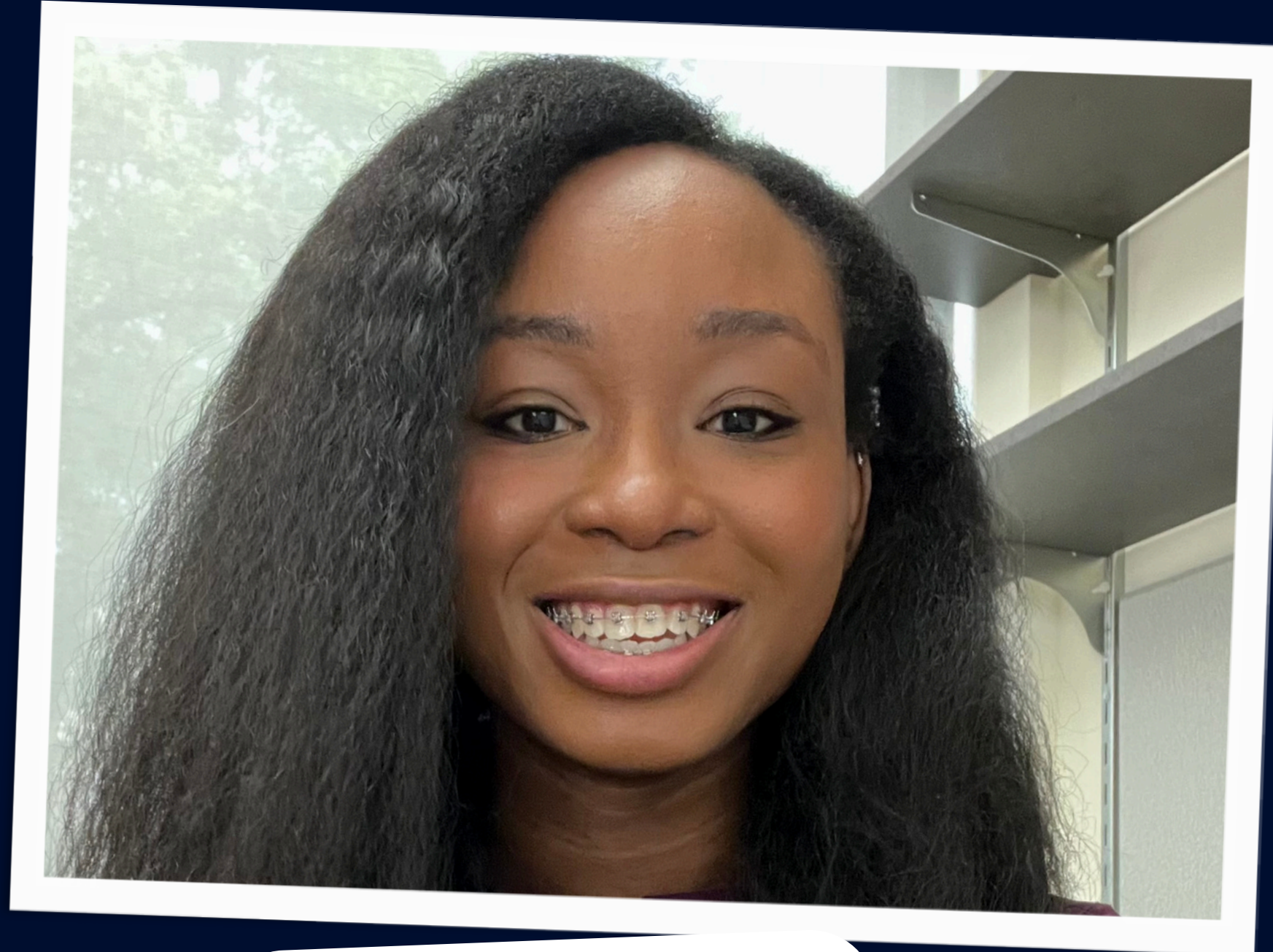


**BOB**
